He is Immediate Past Chair of the Association for the Study of Literature and the Environment, UKI, Managing Editor of *Green Letters: Studies in Ecocriticism*, and the author of *Ecocriticism*, Routledge, 2011.

Daniel Philippon is Associate Professor of English at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities, and a Former President of the Association for the Study of Literature and Environment (ASLE). From March to June 2012 he is serving as a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Turin and the University of Gastronomic Sciences, Bra.

Serenella Iovino is Senior Researcher and Professor of Ethics at the University of Turin and a Former President of the European Association for the Study of Literature, Culture and Environment (EASLCE). She is the author of *Ecologia letteraria*. *Una strategia di sopravvivenza* (Milano, Edizioni Ambiente, 2006) and *Filosofie dell'ambiente*. *Etica, natura, società* (Roma, Carocci, 2004). Her co-edited book (with Serpil Oppermann), *Material Ecocriticism*, is forthcoming with Indiana University Press.

Anna Re is researcher at the IULM Free University of Languages and Communication. She received her MA in literature and environment from the University of Nevada, Reno, USA. Her publications include *Italian Environmental Literature* (2003) and *Americana Verde* (2008).
