INTRODUCTION

The **first International Conference** of the EU project "**LIFE WolfAlps EU**" provides a great opportunity to get specific information on the state of the art of project activities and on the wolf situation in the Alps. The focus will be on the great transnational coordinated teamwork built to favour wolf-human coexistence at the wolf population scale.

The conference will be held on May 27, 2021 via web streaming on Zoom, simultaneously translated into 4 languages (English, Italian, French, Slovenian) and shared for free on YouTube and Facebook (in English).

The morning session will open with a brief presentation of the overall project goals, structure and activities of the project, as well as inspiring speeches by key actors from the EU Commission and the LIFE Programme. Then, the project partners will report on the wolf situation in every Alpine country, highlighting the issues and the coordinated actions triggered by the project. The morning session will be closed with a round table to discuss the past, present and future of the wolf management in Europe.

The afternoon will focus on the presentation of selected international activities by each international working group. These address monitoring, genetics, livestock protection, the relationship between human activities, predators and prey, the prevention of illegal poisoning and the anti-poisoning dog units, the development of a participatory approach with thematic platforms and the stewardship program, the topic of overall education and training of young people, the young ranger program, the attitude and perception about wolves, as well as the effective communication of the project in a digital era.

The various topics will be presented by a speaker (in bold in the agenda), who will take the stand on behalf of the whole international team (in normal type).
