The idea behind the conference

The current situation caused by Covid-19 is a worldwide challenge for all events. The online international conference could facilitate the sharing of experiences (public sector, non-profit sector, academics, people involved in philanthropy...) in the field of social policies from different countries. They will present their own projects and related evaluations highlighting the reasons underneath the project or policy and the model adopted for the evaluation.

The conference includes:

- 9 key notes: opening speeches that outline the theme of the day with reference to the evaluation of projects carried out by the presenting organisations
- 10 papers: presentation of evaluation experiences carried out by promoters or other entities
- 1 round table

Goals of the conference

- To share solutions and strategies with reference to the different contents of socially relevant projects.
- To know the development of solutions to assess the social impact in different social and cultural contexts.
- To give continuity to the comparison started in 2018 in Rome
- To disseminate the results of the comparison.

After the conference

After the conference, all presentations will be gathered in a special issue in Italian and English language.

The special issue will include a summary of the results and recommendations, edited by the foundations promoting the conference.
